**WHY:** Malin Fezehai is a Swedish photographer based in New York City. After studying photography in Sweden, she attended the full-time program at the International Center of Photography in New York. Her work consists of long-term projects in Europe, the Americas, and Africa. She has also worked as a volunteer at Mother Theresa's orphanage for HIV-positive children in Ethiopia.

Fezehai's photographs bring a fresh perspective on vulnerable children—living, playing, and working. Out of their growth comes the hope for a better future.

As the most recent recipient of the GFC/ICP Photography Fellowship, Fezehai focused her lens on children who are being served by innovative grassroots groups in Lima, Cusco, and Washington, DC. These groups are: Escuelas Deporte y Vida (Sports and Life Schools), Asociación de Defensa de la Vida (Association for the Defense of Life), Yanapanakusun (Let's Help Each Other), and Life Pieces to Masterpieces. They represent the more than 240 grassroots organizations that have worked with The Global Fund for Children ([www.globalfundforchildren.org](http://www.globalfundforchildren.org)) in its more than 12 years of philanthropy.
